Vehicle and Equipment Inspection Requirements

(DRAFT 1 - November 16, 2009)

Organizations shall maintain inspection, maintenance, repair and service records for all vehicles and equipment used for emergency operations.

All inspections, maintenance and repairs shall be conducted and performed in accordance with the manufacturer's recommended procedures.

A preventive maintenance and service program shall be established and records maintained.

All Fire Apparatus and emergency response units shall be DOT inspected by a qualified technician.

Fire Pumps on apparatus shall be serviced tested annually.

Aerial Devices shall be inspected and service tested annually.

All equipment carried on emergency vehicles or designated for training shall be visually inspected routinely.

Records shall be maintained for the equipment carried on each vehicle

All ground ladders shall be inspected and service tested by a qualified technician.

All fire hose shall be inspected and service tested.

All fire extinguishers shall be inspected and tested.

All SCBA units shall be tested and serviced within the periods specified by the manufacturers and the applicable governmental agencies.
